Hope Emergency is supported, in part, by the generosity of individuals and businesses that give annually to the Freestore Foodbank.

It's well known that people of our great United States of America are the greatest and most generous humans on the globe. Hope Emergency is blessed to have many of those humans on our side. We have so many benefactors who give cash and personal items to us frequently. Some who have little cash but offer their valuable time make our service exist. We try to thank everyone publicly and pray that their generosity be returned to them threefold.

In the past few months we have received some very generous donations from donors who wish to remain anonymous. Items we have received have impacted our operations by making our volunteers' work easier and safer and by organizing our stock and making distribution days run smoother.

For instance: Our walk-in freezer was failing. With the increase in client numbers we required more storage room for perishables. We received a newer much larger walk-in freezer from a Donor who also provided the professionals who delivered, installed, and removed the old freezer. Along with the walk-in freezer, came two almost new chest freezers.

We received lots of new shelving, storage containers and carts which allow us to improve our process of receiving, storing and delivery of items to our clients. All of these items, many of them on wheels, have been shared with all three buildings.

The clothing building was revamped with shelves that added an extra layer of storage on top for extra stock. A large movable safety ladder was also donated for easy and safe access to the higher areas. The shelving area was custom designed to accommodate large 'laundry type' bins that are used for receiving donations. These bins can be pushed under the lower shelves allowing more room to work around. Metal racks on wheels were repurposed for volunteers to sort, size and hang clothing for the distribution room.

Our Personal Care Department had a new facelift by using the collapsible containers making it easier and neater to store and separate smaller items.

Two New Semi-trailers were donated to store seasonal items. The old one was leaking and falling apart and was no longer usable for storage. Volunteers built steps and landings in front of both trailers to allow for easy access to load and unload.

Soon after these donations came in, we received another donation to widen the main building with a sidewalk and overhang. It provides shelter while loading groceries into clients' cars especially during inclement weather. Several of our volunteers suggested this, made monetary donations and worked extra days to make it happen. Our staff member, Mike Stacy directed the project while other staffers (Shelly Kirby and Amanda Widmeyer) took up the slack allowing Mike to concentrate on its completion. You might have noticed that the entrance to Hope Emergency has also been improved with a section of paving to prevent loose gravel and pooling of
